7.	Meet the Hendersons – Alcohol & Parenting Don't Mix campaign	SM spoke to this Grampian wide parenting campaign involving the three ADP's which was launched in July 2013. The focus is to make parents aware of their drinking behaviours and how this can impact on the outcomes and experiences of their children.  The first phase of the campaign worked with Northsound and Moray Firth Radio and comprised of three short air time infomercials. A website where the fictional family 'The Hendersons' was also created where links were signposted parents to information. The campaign has evaluated very positively.  The 2 <sup>nd</sup> phase is now underway and will involve further promotion and development of the website with a focus on a role model approach as the evaluation highlighted that parents in general had not appreciated the impact that their alcohol consumption could have on their children.  Flyers promoting the website will be produced and distributed via children/schools to parents, primary aged and S1 & S2.  The campaign was broadly welcomed and supported by this group. The following suggestions were made for the development of possible scenario's to highlight key messages- parent's in supermarket with children making the choice to purchase alcohol; babysitting and alcohol, pre-school children. 8.	Scottish Families Affected by Alcohol & Drugs.	SMC welcomed Tanja Mehrer Family Support Development Officer Grampian to the meeting.  Tanja provided some background information on the development of the organisation. The service is commissioned by Scottish Government working on behalf of these families to support, provide information, give advice and raise awareness of the issues affecting them. Alcohol was incorporated into the remit in summer 2013.  A mapping and survey is being undertaken across Grampian and Moray, The MADP is supporting local links and the promotion of the survey which will be reported through the MADP when complete.  Tanja has been supported by the MADP to link with its Front Line Forum sessions as an opportunity to engage with services locally, and Tanja would also be supported to make links with the wider MADP partnership such as the workforce development sub group as this has been identified as an area for development on family inclusive practice.  The group was not aware of the free confidential out of hours helpline- it was agreed to help with promoting this locally via the MADP and services. It was agreed that Fabio Villani would represent the 3 <sup>rd</sup> sector on this group that would include interfacing with agencies such as Scottish Families Affected by Alcohol & Drugs.	TM
